The BEO Events

The aim of the BEO is to further the knowledge and understanding of the English language through practical means, whilst students develop skills in leadership, public speaking, team building and time management – all key areas that they will require to become leaders in their chosen fields in the future. Each school should ensure that all team members participate fully throughout the event, and that they work closely as a team and support one another.

Whilst winning remains important, the spirit of the BEO is that each and every student should be encouraged to be the best that they can be. The competition is broken down into a series of challenges, which are assessed and graded by a select panel of judges.

*The competition theme and projects change every year, always focusing on global issues.

Competition Events

BEO Debate 2.0

Taking the form of a debate, a pre-determined contemporary social issue will be discussed amongst the competing teams.

BEO Improvisation Challenge

Students will be tested on their creativity and ingenuity, using limited resources to achieve the goal of the task. Teams will be briefed on the task on the day of the challenge.

BEO Keynote Presentation

Teams will engage with the competition theme at a deeper level in this challenge, researching an assigned topic which they will present to other teams in the UK.

BEO Mystery Challenge

Teams will be challenged on a creative as well as linguistic level, receiving a brief of the challenge and 3 hours to prepare. The challenge theme will be linked to the competition.

BEO Drama Festival

Teams must write a script based on the theme of the competition, which they will prepare prior to travelling to the UK. They will perform their play at the BEO.

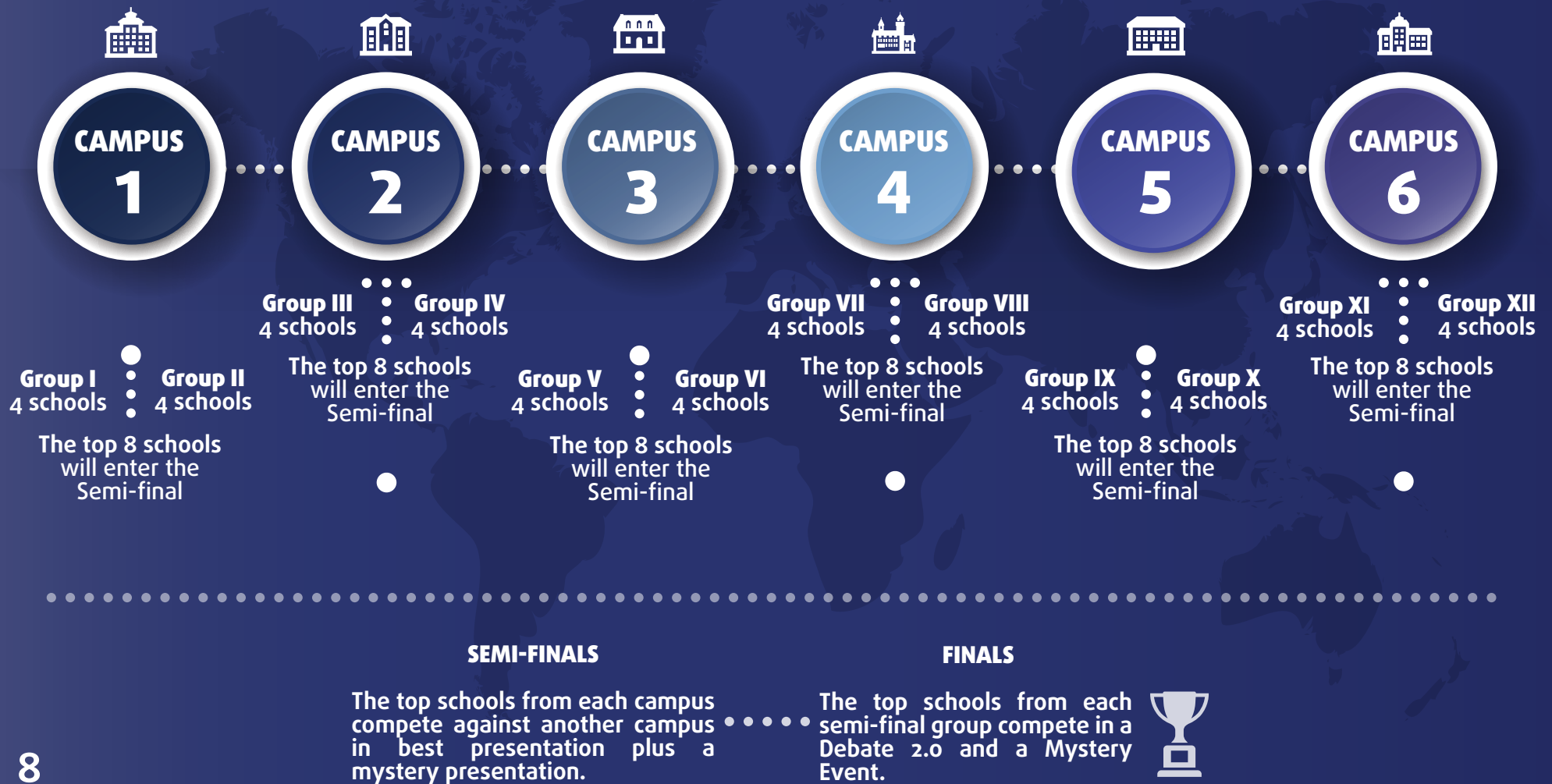
BEO Song Contest

Teams must write a song relating to the competition theme, which they will perform a cappella. Teams will prepare the song prior to their arrival in the UK and may use body percussion or beat boxing to emulate the sound of instruments.

Beo Country Spotlight

Teams must represent a given country at a university fair for professors and students. The aim of the presentation is to attract travellers aged 18 to 25 and students who are studying for a degree in communication.

OIEG representative visit

A member of the OIEG staff or BEO World will visit your school to discuss the programme in more detail.

The visits, dates and times will be confirmed in advance via email or by telephone. We would appreciate it if you could give us one hour of your time for the school inspection and interviews. During our visit, we would like to cover the following:

- An interview with your English coordinator. Here we will discuss your ESL programmes, teaching methods, academic levels, etc.
- An interview with at least two of your English teachers
- An interview with four to six students
- A quick overview of your school's premises

As our representatives are very busy, visiting over 200 schools, please understand that the visit should not last more than 60 minutes.



School Acceptance Notification

If your school has been selected to participate in the British English Olympics 2018, you will receive the notification by email within two weeks of the UK Representative's visit.

From there, please find the REGISTER section, and follow the on-screen instructions.

In 24 hours, you should receive confirmation of your registration.

This will be followed by a promotional kit, given to you by your BEO representative, which will contain all the material you need to help you promote the BEO within your school. Please be aware that all promotional materials that are provided are sponsored by BEO WORLD HEAD OFFICE.

Selection Of Students

Remember: the better the selection of students you make to take part in the BEO, the better chance you will have of winning the competition! Promotion must therefore be planned very carefully in order to attract your strongest students. Each school must have a minimum of 12 and maximum of 20 students enrolled. All students participating in the BEO 2018 need to fulfil the following requirements:

- Aged between 12 and 16 at the time of the event.
- Be at a minimum B1 English level.

Please consider inviting as many students as possible, so you have a greater chance of forming a strong team.

To be sure your students are at the correct level to participate in the BEO, we suggest your students take the OTCC examination to ensure that they are at a B1 level of English. For more information on the OTCC, see page 46.

Parent Meetings

First Parent Meeting

The first parent meeting and presentation is very important because it will determine how many students join the BEO from your school. You need to think very carefully about the methods you use to promote the BEO within your school – the better you do it, the more parents will attend your presentation and the more students you will recruit. Remember: you need at least 12!

Student Enrolment and Information Submission

Once you have completed your first presentation, the parents will have around 15 days to enrol their child. It is up to your school to decide how you receive payments and enrolments. The most common framework for dealing with enrolments is the following:

1. Payments made to the school cashier
 2. Parents receive a receipt of proof of payment
 3. Keep a copy of this receipt of proof of payment for your records
- When the first payment is made, ask students for the completed general enrolment form.
 - Make a list of students enrolled and payments made.

Submission Of Information

After the enrolment period is concluded, we will ask you to submit all the enrolment forms and student information to the BEO representative in your country.

Additional Meetings

These meetings are specially designed for parents of students who have already enrolled.

As soon as you finish with enrolments and have your group of students, you may proceed with the second parent meeting. This meeting explains the whole programme in more detail, addressing any immediate concerns the parents might have.

BEO Preparation – In order to obtain the best possible score at the BEO, you should schedule a good preparation programme for your students. We suggest that you spend at least 40 training hours with them, but it of course remains up to each individual school how long they spend preparing for the programme.

BEO Project & Presentation – Your students will have to prepare all projects and presentations before their arrival. Detailed information will be provided on our website, and you will be provided with all the necessary information and guidance you need at the Kick Off.

If you are from a country which requires a visa to enter the UK, your local BEO representative will provide advice and support to help you with the UK visa application process. Since you will be travelling with 12 to 20 students, you are considered a group by travel agencies and airlines. The BEO is happy to help with arranging your flights, which includes some great benefits!

Why Book Flights with BEO?

- The whole school will be booked on the same flight with the teacher.
- If name changes are necessary, they will be received up to 60 days prior to departure.

Paris

With one of the most iconic skylines, Paris is the heart and capital city of France. A city overflowing with cultural heritage and history, Paris is home to many world-famous attractions such as: the Louvre Museum (showcasing Da Vinci's Mona Lisa), the Notre Dame Cathedral, the Champs-Élysées, the Arc de Triomphe and, of course, the Eiffel Tower.

Originally built as a temporary construction, the Eiffel Tower has quickly become one of the most recognisable and famous landmarks in France. Erected in 1889 for the Universal Exposition, the Eiffel Tower was never dismantled and remains, to this day, an enduring symbol of the city.

A city both delicate and beautiful, bursting with museums and breathtaking architecture, Paris is not a city to be missed.

Brussels, Amsterdam and Bruges

Brussels

Also considered the capital of the European Union, the capital city of Belgium is a city of contrasts, alternating between the traditional and the modern, as well as the French and the Flemish. A unique city, Brussels is famous for everything from its military and arts to its chocolate.

Amsterdam

Vienna

Dominated by the stunning Baroque architecture of its Museum Quarter, the capital city of Austria is emblematic of the wealth and splendour of the Hapsburg monarchy. Nicknamed “the City of Music,” Vienna has served as inspiration for some of the greatest musical masters of our time, including Mozart and Haydn, and remains the final resting place of the composer Ludwig Van Beethoven. Home to a rich variety of theatres, opera houses and museums, there is no shortage of attractions to see in this truly picturesque city.

Munich

One of the fastest-growing and most prosperous cities in the world, Munich is a European centre of art, culture and technological innovation. The city’s many museums and royal avenues celebrate the proud traditions and history of Bavaria, and its theatres and opera houses have produced some of the greatest composers of our time, including Wagner and Strauss. BECAUSE WE CARE

At **BEO**, we believe that education goes both ways. For this reason, we have created **Oxford Education**, which exists to ensure that teachers are provided both the possibility and the tools with which to master the foundations and fundamentals of educating children in the English language. The academy supports teachers in all aspects of their teaching, aiming to foster not only a new generation of students confident in the English language, but a like-minded generation of English language teachers too.

The English Village is an online certified English Platform for schools, which is accredited by Oxford International and Oxford Education.



The content is spread over a 36 week period. Each study week students will work on interactive reading, reading comprehension, vocabulary, grammar exercises, listening and listening comprehension, designed to take 20 minutes each and are automatically marked.

The English Village offer support year-round which has been developed for students who are looking for more ways to improve their English and teachers who are looking for new tools to extend their tuition.

Students may be given a level according to their school year or a placement test (Oxford TCC) may be taken to select the most appropriate level.

The learning materials are created by an academic team who are supported by regional consultants who work to make sure our programme complements the English teaching in the participating schools.

The syllabus is based around relevant and interesting topics such as Entertainment, Environment, Science and Technology, Sports and Fash-

ion, and is available to all teachers at the beginning of the course.

One advantage of English Village is that it has been designed for students of all levels, starting from A1 level and going up to a C2 level on the Common European Framework.

English Village allows students to learn, practice and apply their English language skills.

Teachers have unlimited access to the Teachers' Panel that enables them to closely monitor the progress of their students and detect students who need extra help in their English learning.

At the end of the 36 week period students who complete 80% or more of the English Village will receive, according to the level that they practiced.

The Oxford Tutorial College Certificate is an accredited online English language certification, which is supported by the most renowned universities in the UK, Canada and the United States.

The Oxford Tutorial College Certificate is an accredited qualification of achievement and participation in the English language allowing student to discover their own abilities within a second language.

The learning materials are created by an academic team from London who are supported by regional consultants who work to make sure our exam complements the English learning in participation schools.

The Common European Framework of References for language: learning, teaching and assessment (CEFR) is a guideline used to describe achievements of learners of foreign languages.

There are a number of levels which identify the level of language skills which the learner currently has. All grades are split into three main levels consisting of Basic User which includes A1 beginner level and A2 elementary level. It then continues through to learners becoming inde-

pendent users including a B1 intermediate level and a B2 upper intermediate level.

Finally, there is the proficient user which consists of C1 proficiency or advanced, and C2 which is mastery. The CEFR assesses all areas of language learning including reading, reading comprehension, listening, listening comprehension, use of language, writing and speaking.
